STEWARDSHIP GROWTH

Ship Emphasis process is to impact the stewardship culture in every congregation so that all members would know that they are stewards by God's grace, live as disciples of Jesus, and manage all that God has entrusted to them with joy and generosity, all so that God's purposes are accomplished.

Stewards need to know not only who they are in Christ, they need the opportunity to examine their values and attitudes toward the life they live as God's children in the light of God's Word so they can discern what the world is telling them and what God tells them. As Eugene Peterson cautions, "If I, even for a moment, accept the world's definition of me, I am rendered harmless."

If the stewardship culture in the congregation is to be changed, we need to understand that it will require continuous learning. *Faith Aflame* is designed to help us with this process by focusing on the heart of the steward and not just the billfold. During this coming week, read what the Bible tells us about the proper stewardship culture as it pertains to these characteristics of a Biblical steward.
