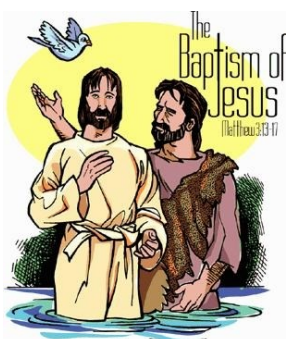

2ND GRADERS AND BIBLE BUDDIES

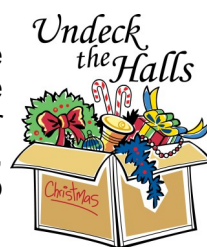

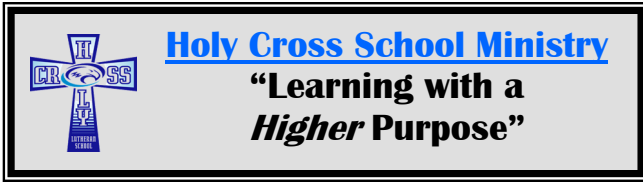

THE MEYER MINUTE By Dr. Dale A. Meyer

“Warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.” (Matthew 2:12)

God gives us warnings that we should change our way. Recently the church celebrated Epiphany, the leading of the Wise Men to Christ, showing that Jesus is for all people. The Wise Men took the logical route, went to Herod and asked about the newborn king. When Herod’s scholars said the child was to be born in Bethlehem, Herod asked the Wise Men to go visit but then return and report to him what they had found. That seems innocent enough. They didn’t know that Herod was treacherous and a murderer.

Things may seem harmless to us but in fact can threaten our lives, our physical lives, our lives in family and community, and our lives with God. So God warns us. Perhaps He warns us by a sleepless night of worry. Your troubled conscience may be God’s doing. Perhaps someone is courageous enough to tell you, “Be careful.” How do you know the warning doesn’t come from God? Certainly the Bible warns us. Read, for example, the Sermon on the Mount. (Matthew 5-7) “Whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.” (Romans 15:4) What warning from God are you heeding today? Your heavenly Father cares about the way you’ll take today. It’s now for you to take His way home.
